**Sermon: Sink Your Roots in Jesus
and Flourish**

Series: True Home #6

Colossians 2:6-7; Ephesians 4:15-16

1. What's one "storm" you've faced recently that made you feel unsteady or toppled some area of life (pressure at work, family stress, unexpected news, or something else)? How did you respond?
2. Think about the people in your life right now. Which relationships tend to energize you and leave you built up? Which ones feel neutral or even deplete your energy? (No names needed—just reflect.)
3. What does it mean to "receive Christ Jesus the Lord" according to the message? How is this more than a one-time decision, and what changes in our identity?
4. Colossians 2:6-7 uses both a journey metaphor ("walk in him") and an agriculture metaphor ("rooted and built up"). How do these two pictures together describe the daily life of someone who has found their true home in Jesus?
5. The message highlights that relationships impact us in three ways: energize, neutral, or deplete. Why is being rooted in Jesus described as the most energizing relationship available, and how does that change how we approach daily life?
6. According to Ephesians 4:15-16, how is our personal growth in Jesus connected to the growth and maturity of the whole church body? What does "each part does its work" look like in real life at FBC Falun?
7. Where in your life right now do you sense your "roots" might be shallow—built more on job performance, finances, self-reliance, or other things than on Jesus? What storm could expose that?
8. What would it look like practically for you to "walk in him" daily this week? Try the simple prayer: "Jesus, where are You walking today? I want to go with You." How might that shift your ordinary moments?
9. Your growth and flourishing in Jesus isn't a private affair—it impacts the body of believers and helps more people find their true home in Jesus. How has someone else's faithfulness encouraged your growth, or how could your flourishing help someone else this week?
10. How will you live out "Sinking our roots deep in Jesus will grow a flourishing life and a flourishing church" this week? Share one specific step you will take and a prayer request for accountability and support from the group.
