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1. What are you doing in this season of life—going through the motions, making a living, or giving yourself to something God is building?
 2. Share a “dark time” you have walked through (culture drift, ministry disappointment, workplace pressure, illness, or a dying dream). What did it reveal about what you value?
 3. In Jeremiah 32, why does buying a field during a siege look foolish—and what does handing the deed to Baruch proclaim about God?
 4. What stands out about Baruch writing, reading, and rewriting God’s Word in Jeremiah 36 after the king burned the scroll?
 5. How does Jeremiah 43 show the cost of remaining faithful when leaders reject God’s Word and blame the messenger?
 6. Read Jeremiah 45:1–5. What does God name in Baruch’s weariness, and what does He promise?
 7. Where are you tempted to seek “great things” for yourself instead of a quiet supporting role?
 8. Who is a hard-pressed leader, family member, or friend you could stand with this week the way Baruch stood with Jeremiah?
 9. What next small step of faithful service is God asking you to take even if the times feel dark?
 10. How will you live out “No matter how dark the times, steady faithfulness to God makes an impact” this week? Share a specific prayer request for accountability and support.
